The Curriculum

English

Our text this half term is called The Red Prince. We will be developing our comprehension skills through reading lessons, making predictions and inferences about the text.

Our writing focuses will be basic skills; accuracy with capital letters and full stops, correct spelling of high frequency words and neat, joined handwriting. My aim is to tackle these this half term before moving on to a wider range of Year 4 writing skills in the second part of the Autumn term.

Maths

We will initially revisit column addition and subtraction before looking at place value and numbers up to 10,000. We have a strong focus on times tables and the children have booklets in school to practice them. I will be sending home resources to support this as part of our home learning.

Science

In Science we will begin by looking at living things and how to classify them. We will then start a unit of work on states of matter – looking closely at solids, liquids and gases.

Computing

We will initially focus on online safety and the importance of being a responsible digital citizen before moving on to a unit of work on animations and using Scratch 3 to deliver this.

History

Our history topic focuses on the Victorians.

We will focus on these areas:

- Culture How did the Industrial Revolution change Britain?
- Stories Why was Queen Victoria such a popular monarch?
- Legacies Which Victorian inventions do we still use today?
- Belief How did the Victorians improve the life of children?
- Individuals Who was Thomas John Barnado?

This will be supported by a trip to Ripon Workhouse Museum.



Art

We will be looking at the artist William Morris and creating some wallpaper using repeated patterns.

P.E.

Our P.E. days are Monday and Wednesday and will be held outside until the weather becomes colder. Children should come to school in their outdoor PE kit on Monday and Wednesday mornings and will remain in it all day. Please check the school website if you require clarification of the correct PE kit.

Home Learning

Home Learning will come out on Friday 13th September and will consist of the following:

- One weekly reading book
- One set of half termly optional maths tasks

- One termly home learning project.
