
English



We will continue reading our class novel 'The Thirteenth Home of Noah Bradley'. We will be working on answering a variety of comprehension questions and ensuring we are more confident with a range of grammar and punctuation. We will also look at writing in a more formal tone.


Maths

This half term we will finish our four operations unit then start to look at our understanding of fractions. We will be looking at comparing, ordering, adding, subtracting, simplifying and finding equivalent fractions. We will also be doing some Christmas coordinates towards the end of term. We will regularly practice the four operations to build fluency and confidence.



Science

After we've finished learning about Carl Linnaeus, the children will then complete a unit on electricity. We will explore the following questions:



- How can I get my circuit to work?
- How do we draw circuits using scientific symbols?
- Can variations affect my circuit?
- Can I plan and investigate an experiment involving voltage?

Topic: History

Our history topic for this term is *The Anglo Saxons and Scots*. Y5 and 6 will continue to explore the following questions:

- Culture Where did the Anglo-Saxons and Scots come from and why Britain?
- Stories What is Sutton Hoo?
- Legacies How did the Anglo-Saxons change Britain?
- Individuals Who is Beowulf?
- Belief What did the Anglo-Saxons believe?

Our P.E days are **Tuesday and Friday**. Children need to attend school on these days in their school uniform P.E kit. This half term's lessons will focus on hockey and dance.


Foundation Subjects



In **music**, we will continue to focus on rhythmic devices and structure; we will explore time signatures, perform a variety of rhythms including polyrhythms and organise rhythmic ideas in a structure.



In **computing**, we will be looking at coding.





Building on last half term's topic of self-description, Year 6 will learn personal pronouns in **French**. This will enable them to conjugate verbs in full, the focus being on the essential irregular verb, 'être' (to be).



Our **R.E** topic continues to explore how Sikhs symbolise commitment.

Home Learning

Reading: The children will visit the library on a Friday afternoon and will be able to check out one book per week. The children will not be able to get a new library book until they have returned the previous one. Within our library session, we will be continuing our prosody sessions, developing our oracy and fluency skills. We would like the children to practice reading aloud to someone at home at least once a week; it doesn't have to be the book they've borrowed from school. We ask that someone at home then signs and dates the reading record each week and that they bring it in to be checked on the Friday.

Maths: There will be a weekly maths task sent home every Friday; it will then be collected in the following Thursday. This is a mandatory piece of home learning that needs to be done every week. There will also be half termly suggestions to support Maths and English that will be sent out the second Friday of each half term.

Topic: We would like each child to complete a project at home linked to our topic. I will resend out a sheet of ideas but the children can do whatever sparks their interest. It is not mandatory but we will have a home learning gallery on Tuesday 2nd December to show off all the children's fantastic work.

Spellings: We will be learning four words each week and practising them during the school day. However, if you feel like it would benefit your child to also practice these at home, the words for each week are listed below.
